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#### Holiness

JUNE

Often I have prayed, as you have, that God would give me insight about a difficult decision with which I was faced. For example, most recently, I prayed about whether purchasing another automobile was the right choice for my family. While I believe such prayers to be valid, I wonder if my motives behind these prayers are based on my desire to truly know God's will or on my desire to choose what will make my life better or easier. In other words, I want God to play fortune teller, to look into my future and give me insight as to how well such a purchase would work out for me and not whether it is His will for my family. Let me put it to you one more way. I wanted the benefit of the power of His omniscience without submitting to the authority of His Lordship.

I know this to be the case because there are other areas of my life that I know with absolute certainty what God's will is, and yet, about those things I seemed to be much less convicted. One such area is God's desire for my holiness. Ephesians 1:4 says that "he chose reflect the holiness of the God we are called to us in him before the creation of the world to be holy and blameless in his sight." It's not just His desire that we should be holy; it is His plan. His eternal purpose is to look at me and see one who is "holy and blameless." What a marvelous truth. God's eternal plan is that I should look like Jesus forever. It's not just an illusion; the Bible says that God is actually changing us into the image of His Son. (Romans 8:29) While I accept and welcome the idea that God will one day perfect me for all eternity, I'm not nearly as excited about partnering with Him in the current process of sanctification. I know from Scripture that it is God's will that I should be sanctified (1 Thes 4:3), and yet I don't pursue holiness...just a new car.

All throughout scripture, God has expressed a desire that His people should be separate from the world around them, set apart. This is not merely a matter of geography, meaning we should literally segregate ourselves from

unbelievers, but rather it is an issue of holiness, that we should be consecrated for His purposes and nothing else. We can see an illustration of the separateness that God desires for His people even in the pages of the Old Testament.

In the tabernacle, there were articles that were designed specifically for use in the sacrifices and worship that took place there. They were said to be consecrated, a Hebrew word meaning "to set apart." They were not to be used for common purposes. They were reserved for God alone and had to be purified with the sprinkling of blood before they were acceptable to God. In the same way, Aaron, the high priest who ministered before God, also had to be sprinkled with blood for his purification in order that he might enter the Most Holy Place. It was the blood that made everything acceptable. We also, having been permanently cleansed by the blood of Christ, are acceptable before God to serve Him as priests and yet our daily lives don't always serve.

In Jerry Bridges' book The Pursuit of Holiness, he speaks of the "necessity" of holiness in the life of a believer in a chapter entitled, *Holiness is Not an Option*. He says, "When the Holy Spirit comes into our lives at our salvation, He comes to make us holy in practice. If there is not, then, at least a yearning in our hearts to live a holy life pleasing to God, we need to seriously question whether our faith in Christ is *Children's Ministry* 6 genuine...true salvation brings with it a desire to be made holy." I believe that this desire to be like God will inevitably reveal itself in earnest effort on the part of true believers to "not conform any longer to the pattern of this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your minds..." (Romans 12:2)

This may have been what Paul had in mind when he wrote to a young pastor named Timothy and instructed him with these words. But in a great house there are not only vessels of gold and silver, but also of wood and clay,



some for honor and some for dishonor. Therefore if anyone cleanses himself from the latter, he will be a vessel for honor, sanctified and useful for the Master, prepared for every good work. (2 Timothy 2:20-21 -NKJV) Although our sin has been atoned for and our standing before God is secure, there is a cleansing process that needs to continually take place. We are called to be willing participants in that process. Here, we are told that sanctification is a matter of self evaluation. We must determine those things that exist in our lives for dishonorable purposes and cleanse ourselves from them.

But how are we to know the honorable from the dishonorable?

I believe the Bible teaches us to fix our eyes fully on Jesus for the answer, to see Him revealed in the pages of scriptures as a perfect image of the invisible God. We are to make Him our hero and follow His example... imitate His character. That is what I think is meant by the "renewing of your minds." When we see Christ as He really is, in all His glory, we cannot help but put Him back in His rightful place in our lives and crowd out all the counterfeit deities that have captured our affections and influenced our behavior.

Almost every young boy has heroes in his life. As a young boy, there were people whom I would emulate (usually rock stars or athletes) because they exhibited some quality or characteristic that seemed appealing to me. Something about their very existence made me want to be like them. Today, clothing, hairstyles, music, even our language is shaped by people's desire to be conformed to the image of their heroes. Our very heart's desire is to be a carbon copy of those people whom we worship. One possible reason for the unholy condition of many professing believers today could be the unholy condition of their idols who have replaced the true God. (Even our TV shows testify to it – American Idol among others). We have lost the desire for holiness because we have lost the sense of awe we once had for the living God. Maybe we've lost our sense of awe because we no longer see God as He really is...in all His glory!

Our first challenge is to see God and to see Him as He really is. While this is partially possible in our view of creation, the only true and perfect picture of the Father is the Son as revealed to us through the pages of Scripture by His Spirit. The prerequisite to a holy existence is an enlightened and intimate relationship with Jesus Christ. If your personal attempts at *goodness* have proven futile, as they ultimately always will, then give Jesus a try. His work of redemption is what makes our sanctification a possibility. He has procured for us not only a right standing before the Father but the unlimited power of His Spirit for our sanctification.

If it's not your heart's desire to live a life which is conformed to the image of your Creator then maybe you have only experienced God in theory and never really personally met Him. I would invite you to discover Him for the first time in His Word. Or, maybe you do know Him but just haven't been face down in His presence in a long time...His real overwhelming presence.

The second challenge is to not focus on, and ultimately covet, a world that denies the existence of a perfect. holy and glorious God because they would then have to bow in submission to His authority. Rather you should "set your hearts (focus) on things above, where Christ is seated at the right hand of God."

Church family, God's desire for us is that we should be holy. It was the shedding of the precious blood of Jesus that has made it possible for us to become holy in His sight. Should we not then submit to His desire that we be made holy in our daily lives? I challenge you to spend some time meditating through the pages of Scriptures on the holiness of God. See Him in all of His glorious splendor. I have listed some of my favorite passages below for you to consider along with a few books that I highly recommend. I pray that we all can experience the glory of God anew and that He would rekindle a passion in our hearts to "reflect the glory of the Lord. And the Lord—who is the Spirit—makes us more and more like him as we are changed into his glorious image." (2 Corinthians 3:18 NLT)


