I was raised in a small mid-Western town; and grew up in and came to faith in a small, rural church [Church of Christ grace. I knew that we said "Grace" denomination]; and having come to faith before we ate our supper [in the country and being baptized when I was about nine years old, I had an appropriate understanding of both the Gospel of Christ and of sin; and had a child's understanding of the fallen nature both of myself and of mankind in general. I recall very distinctly that in my life leading up to and following my baptism, I very much wanted to live my life for Christ and to please Him; and so I was very eager to learn all of the information that I could in order to live out the life that Christ would have me to live. As a result, I paid very keen attention to every word from the preacher's mouth, learned all that I could in Sunday School and in the youth programs and my own Bible Studies, as now that I was a Christian "formally", I wanted to learn and know how to be a Christian, and how to honor God with my life.

Having grown up in church and been around church long before I myself came to faith, one of my favorite Gospel Hymns both now and then, is "Amazing Grace". I very much liked the words, I especially liked that according to the words of the song, that I was saved, that I once was lost and blind; but now I am found and I see, that my chains were gone and that I have been set free, all of which was bestowed upon me, according to the song, the hour I first believed. AWESOME! This all sounded so very fantastic, but the only

issue was that no one really explained to me exactly what was meant by you eat supper in the evening], and that on occasion, I would hear people say that a person was "graceful", presumably meaning that they moved with ease. As a result, I was not entirely sure what had accomplished all of these wonderful things that the song mentions, perhaps it was a really awesome prayer, as the song is called, "Amazing Grace", we say Grace before supper and apparently the sound of which is guite sweet? I was not sure and despite my asking, this fundamental concept was not explained to me.

Unfortunately, my confusion over this fundamental Biblical principal only increased in direct correlation to the amount of time that I spent in church, as the church that we went to at this time believed in self-righteous legalism. As an example, the preacher would routinely say that he had not sinned during a given week or month; and as for anyone who had, that they needed to come to the front of the church and be re-baptized for their sins. Regretfully, no one would venture down front to be re-baptized for their sins of the week and the congregation went along with this ridiculous notion that they had spent the preceding week completely devoid of sin. I knew that I had sinned and the only reason that I could formulate in my mind why anyone would go along with this, was that perhaps I was the only

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one in the church who had sinned over the prior week; otherwise, people would be lined up each Sunday to be re-baptized for their sins of the preceding week. As an example of legalism, this same preacher spent a great deal of time telling the congregation how we were going to Hell, for any number of arguably minor infractions, such as but not limited to: watching TV, watching movies, telling jokes, talking to your friends about anything other than God, not wearing your best clothes to church each and every time that you come to church, consumption of any alcohol whatsoever, not being baptized each time that we sin, playing musical instruments in church, et cetera. As you can see from the list, most, if not all of these are items are Pharasitically legalistic in that in His Word God does not tell us that any of these items are sins, rendering this a man-made list created to earn our way into Heaven.

At this point, based upon what I had been repeatedly told in church, if I do not perfectly keep all of the Biblical Law in addition to this list of arbitrary items as outlined by the preacher, the list of which seemingly grew each week, then I do not love God and therefore, He does not love me, I am not a child of God. Worst of all, I was told that without question, I am going to Hell to be eternally separated from God in agony for all of eternity. All of this supposedly because I watched a movie or did not wear my best outfit to church or if I sinned at all. ever. Even worse, we were repeatedly told that you may ask for God's forgiveness for any given sin [e.g., lying] ONCE; and He might forgive you, if you truly repent of that sin; however, if you commit this same sin ever again, then this is evidence that you did not truly repent; and God will not forgive that second sin and you are going to Hell.

I must confess that this sounded awful, it made me sick to my stomach and despite my repeated questions to my parents they were unwilling to discuss this issue. Not knowing any better and having not yet developed an adult's ability to guestion this. I believed what the preacher had said and assumed that perhaps he had derived this arcane knowledge that if I am going to Hell for committing the same sin twice, watching a movie, telling a joke or not wearing my best clothes to church each week, then it was most likely that I was going to Hell regardless, rendering church obsolete and living a life that was pleasing to God unaccomplishable. Moreover, I concluded that neither I, nor anyone else could attain to any of these things, despite their claims. I was very confused by all of this and wondered, "Why would the God who loves me, who sent His Son to die for me, devise such a system in which we are doomed to eternally fail?" This one thing I was certain of: if I were to be saved on the basis of my ability to not sin, saved based upon my ability to adhere to all of God's Law, all of the time, let alone this preacher-concocted list of items, then I could not be saved nor could anyone else, despite their claims of a sinless life.

Thankfully, we left that small town and came to live in Mansfield in 1986. After finding a place to live, our next order of business was to find a church. We exhaustively tried several churches but unfortunately, they too were steeped in heretical teaching, self-righteousness and legalism. My parents being unwilling to consider another denomination, decided that we would have church at home and so on Sunday mornings, we would conduct a family Bible Study. In retrospect, this was my first step away from walking with God, as now we were facing all of the trials and pressures of life in a new place, in what we regarded as a big city, life as a young adult; and my parents had elected to take us out of church in light of the fact that we could not find, "a good church", in the area. I loved God but thought that no matter what I did or how hard I tried, that based upon my understanding of His expectations that I could not please God with my life. As I got into high school, this Sunday morning Bible

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study slowly became replaced with work. Slowly, the ways of the world came to be part of my life and influence my thoughts, behaviors and expectations about life. I started driving, and coupled with being an athlete, I faced the temptations associated with that; and in my experience, I could not speak to my parents about any of this, as they could not handle discussing these topics very well and merely turned a blind eye. As a result, I was a teenager facing the temptations and pitfalls of an adult world, without God in my life or the listening ear of my parents. Perhaps my parents were facing a similar struggle, as their relationship with each other and with my brother and I, began to degrade severely as well. I made good grades in school, graduating at the top of my class; and I was an accomplished athlete, as well as, holding a job throughout High School. Unfortunately, with instability at home, I was not able to attend college immediately. I was uncertain about what I wanted to do with my life; and as a result, I ended up joining the United States Marine Corps, at the age of seventeen. So, I went on with my life, I always loved God and sought to please Him with my life, but was convinced that I could not, based upon what I had been taught about His expectations of me. Additionally, other than this misconception about what God wanted of my life, I had been taught very little about how to be a Godly person, let alone an adult. So, I served in the Marines, made my way through college and graduate school, earning degrees with high marks along the way, with nothing really changing, other than to say that in retrospect I was growing ever farther away from God. I sought myself in any number of worldly things like academic accomplishments, physical accomplishments, professional accomplishments, promotions, positions and the accumulation of material wealth and material items.

No matter what I achieved, no matter how much I worked or endeavored, no matter how much I put myself into a given thing irrespective of how difficult it was to achieve, no matter what thing I pursued for short-term pleasure or enjoyment, I began to realize that all of those things were empty, shallow and devoid of meaning or composition. They were ALL an illusion, in that I thought that once I had achieved a given item or degree or honor or promotion, that THEN I would be satisfied with myself and with my life. I often wondered if perhaps the meaning of life was in the journey and not necessarily in the objective. I began to try to enjoy the journey more and not simply strive ceaselessly for the finish line, but still satisfaction, joy and any sense of accomplishment always eluded me; and so, I would always think that perhaps after the next given goal or achievement, then I will be satisfied. I was wrong, for it was not to be, as that joy and satisfaction which I so eagerly sought in the things of this world ALWAYS eluded me. ~ Josh

PAW Fall



The Preschool Academy of Westchester (PAW) is a quality preschool program for children aged 9 months-5 years old. It is a time for both you and your children to enjoy. While in our care your children will enjoy their classroom activities planned around our curriculum, "Wee Learn" (published by LifeWay). At our program, your child will learn about sharing, healthy living, academics, music, American sign-language, the Bible, manners, cooperation and giving.

Admission Age: Classes are provided for children between the ages of 9 months and 5 years old.

They will have a busy day planned which will include center activities, outdoor play time, cooking experiences, rest time, snacks, and special day activities (visits from the petting zoo, the local fire station, picture day and more). We do our best to provide a fun and safe learning environment for your child.


