#### The State of the Church

Il Corinthians 2:1-5 And when I came to you, brethren, I did not come with superiority of speech or of wisdom, proclaiming to you the testimony of God. For I determined to know nothing among you except Jesus Christ, and Him crucified. I was with you in weakness and in fear and in much trembling, and my message and my preaching were not in persuasive words of wisdom, but in demonstration of the Spirit and of power, so that your faith would not rest on the wisdom of men, but on the power of God.

In the US Constitution, there is a requirement that the President of the United States address congress in a State of the Union Address. "He shall from time to time give to Congress information of the State of the Union and recommend to their Consideration such measures as he shall judge necessary and expedient," Article II, Section 3 of the US Constitution. In the television era, this speech has become a big component of the political calendar. It functions more as political talking points that provide a laundry list for future legislation or initiatives or foreign policy programs than as a speech that actually evaluates the state of our country. The party that does not control the White House conducts their own state of the union speech to respond to the talking points of the State of the Union given by the President. Then, we are bombarded with the talking heads' evaluation of both speeches along with analysis and poll results to check the pulse of the nation with respect to all of this. In the end, I rather doubt we have any better assessment of the state of the union.

Periodically, it is a good thing to take a moment to assess the health of a church in order to provide information and to

recommend "such measures that are necessary and expedient." The church is not a democracy though we use some democratic procedures to help make decisions. The church should function as a theocracy where Christ is King and we simply do our best to follow His directions. The execution of this system of church governance challenges us, for Christ does reign supreme. Christ is the only true Sovereign of the universe. He is head of the church by the will of His Father. The challenge presents itself not in any deficiency in Christ but in the church. Sin, human weakness, the world around us, the battle with the devil and his minions make hearing our rightful King clearly, and following His instruction, quite difficult. But we must listen to Him. We must strive to seek His priorities for our church because He is our Sovereign. He is a loving, benevolent dictator. He is a loving bride-groom that seeks what is best for His bride, the church. In the assessment of the church, we must base what we think on His assessment. As a pastor, when I address the state of the church in this article, it is with trepidation. For all of us are prone to see things the way we wish to see them. But in doing this assessment, I am asking us to consider how Christ would assess us. What does our King think of the kingdom work in our domain?

Do we say we have a great ministry because of the strength of certain aspects of our leadership or programs or finances or facilities or communication abilities of preachers or musicians? Do we evaluate our church on the quality of teaching in various Bible studies or our development of future leaders or on our involvement in missions? Do we assess ourselves by counting people in worship services or at special events or in Bible study? All of

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these things can be important markers of the underlying health of a church but none of them are sufficient markers of a healthy church. We have all seen even heretical churches grow or have big programs or persuasive teachers or gifted leaders. History is replete with examples of pastors with influential ministries only to discover later that there was unbearable immorality corresponding to all the outward signs of ministerial growth. How then can we rightly assess the ministry of the church if numbers, programs, teachers, teaching, missions, music, giving or facilities alone lack sufficiency in the task? We turn to the Bible. How does the New Testament evaluate the ministry of the church? Paul says of his ministry in Corinth, "I was with you in weakness and in fear and in much trembling, and my message and my preaching were not in persuasive words of wisdom, but in demonstration of the Spirit and of power, so that your faith would not rest on the wisdom of men, but on the power of God." II Corinthians 2:3-5. The power of God not the wisdom of men is the true measure of our ministry. Are we dependent on God for the ministry of the church? Or do we depend on our own abilities and knowledge and resources?

God has richly blessed Matthew Road Baptist Church. Our attendance over the last 13 years has gone from averaging 150 a week to well over 500 a week. We have engaged with missions in almost every part of the globe through our participation with other Baptists in the cooperative program and in our sponsorship of individual mission endeavors such as church planters and bible translators. We have engaged in missions by going to places like Sudan, Rwanda, other North African and middle eastern nations. We have continued to invest in places like India and Mexico with pastor training and evangelism. We continue to invest in future church leaders within our own congregation by following Paul's instructions to Timothy to take the things seen and heard from Paul and "entrust them to faithful men who can teach others." We have grown our internship program and continue to see God at work in the lives of these young adults. Our children, student, and collage aged ministries have grown. Our giving to kingdom work both here and abroad has increased substantially.

There are many other marks of a healthy church that I believe we see at Matthew Road. However, none of these external markers matter if we are not continually pursuing God in humility. We need Him. There is no kingdom work without submission to the King. There is not knowledge apart from the wisdom given by Christ. There is no good works apart from the work of Christ in us. There is no Gospel apart from the Gospel that brings glory to the Savior. There are no mission endeavors unless we are sent. As Jesus said to the disciples, "apart from Me you can do nothing." We must have right theology. We must pursue righteousness in our personal walk with God. We must pursue biblical standards for relationships in the home and in the church. We must seek ways to take the Gospel to every corner of the globe while seeking the lost in every corner of DFW. All of these efforts must be done, but none of them can be done apart from Christ. The life of dependence on Christ must govern each member of the church. The life of dependence on Christ must delineate the church from any other organization in the world. We do not accomplish this ministry through "superiority of speech or of wisdom"... so that our "faith would not rest on the wisdom of men, but on the power of God." I hope Matthew Road is a healthy church. I believe there are some things we can do to continue the patterns of growth, ministry, missions, and discipleship. However, this assessment of our church, this state of the union address, is not a list of new initiatives or a time to bask in the glow of some prior events. This assessment focuses on Christ and His power at work in us. We assess ourselves from His place as our Lord. We assess ourselves from our position of being His servants. May His power work in us as we lean completely on Him.







Bring a dish to share. If you have never played Bunco before, no worries as we will show you how.


