

Matthew Road Academy



It is my pleasure to give MRBC an update on the growth of Matthew Road Academy, and since we are in the midst of registering for the 2014-2015 school year, I thought now would be the perfect time. **O** As many of you know, MRBC has reached out to the homeschooling community for many years. With the blessing of the church, Pastor Daniel Sweet launched MRA in the Fall of 2012 as a partnership between the Academy and interested families. 32 students attended the 2012-2013 school year; attending courses like Systematic Theology, Ancient History and Algebra

on Tu/Th, then completing their homework at home under the supervision of their parents on M/W/F. The University Model of Education is not new to the education world; UME schools have been flourishing in the DFW area for the last 15 years. A UME school strives towards high academic standards and accountability, emphasizes the importance of family values and parental mentoring, equips students with a strong independent work ethic and prepares them with college readiness skills. MRA is self funded through tuition payments from attending families, but is thankful that MRBC is gracious enough to allow us to use the campus facilities on Tu/Th. We have seen many students reached with Christ's love and have been able to minister to the families who attend each week. To our surprise, MRA is not just meeting a need in the homeschooling community, but we have many students from public, private and charter schools. We are thankful that Texas has many education options and that the UME model meets a need in so many families' lives. Currently, we have 126 students on campus, ranging from elementary to highschool. 85% of these families have already registered for the 2014-2015 school year. In addition, we have already had 20 new families that are excited to be a part of MRA next year.

Would you like to support MRA? We would love for you to uplift the school in prayer: *Pray for the staff to show the students and their parents the love of Christ. *Pray for the students, especially the 6th-12th graders who are at a crucial time of deciding their own faith. *Pray for May 5th, we will have a drama based gospel presentation during our end of the year performance. *Pray that God would open a door to family members and friends who might not otherwise come into a church.

*Pray for us as we continue to grow, that God will give us wisdom and grace in the task of educating His children.









