### He Became a Curse for Us

Recently, a friend of mine, asked me about a particular phrase that is sometimes heard within evangelical circles. I have personally the public humiliation and death of His used the phrase which is why he graciously asked about it. In particular the phrase goes something like this: "while on the cross, God the Father turned His back on His Son, Jesus Christ." My friend's question related to the scriptural basis for such a claim.

The fundamental doctrines of the New Testament concern the what and why of the crucifixion and the resurrection of Jesus Christ. There are many pictures given in the servant passage of Isaiah 53. The doctrine New Testament to help us understand the reasons and implications of God giving up His own Son to die in public shame and humiliation for sinners. Many of these pictures are also resident within the Old Testament traditions. For instance, in the presentation by Jews for Jesus, "Christ in the Passover" which we saw on Wednesday evening at our church, the portrait of redemption given in that historic ceremony provides us an understanding of what God has done in the cross of Christ. Paul even refers to Jesus as "our Passover." Another depiction in the New Testament that is anchored in the Old Testament portrays Christ as our kinsman redeemer. He purchases us into His family through the cross. This analogy is found in the redemption of Israel out of bondage from Egypt where God redeems the people through the plagues. This depiction is reflected later in biblical history in the redemption of Ruth and Naomi through Boaz. This is what Christ has done for us. He has redeemed both Jew, Naomi, and Gentile, Ruth, from our impoverished, desperate and hopeless condition. The redemption of Ruth and Naomi cost Boaz

the purchase price of a plot of land. The redemption of sinners cost God own Son.

One of the motif's of the New Testament doctrine of the crucifixion of Jesus Christ is the curse motif. This motif is described by Paul in Galatians 3:10-14. It is also eluded to in the language of propitiation as found in Romans 3:21-26, Hebrews 2:12, I John 2:2 and I John 4:10. It is eluded to in the despised suffering of Jesus Christ becoming a curse for us, bearing the Father's wrath while on the cross, is a doctrine that I think those passages listed above along with several other scripture passages (Romans 5:8-10, I Peter 2:22, Philippians 2:5-11, Ephesians 2:11-16, and II Corinthians 5:21 are some that come to mind). Jesus Christ bore the punishment of our sin while on the cross and the punishment for human sin is ultimately the wrath of God. This answers one of the questions as to why Jesus Christ had to die because it addresses how a holy God can receive sinners and maintain His justice and holiness.

When I use a sentence like "God turned his back on His own Son" it is because I think the curse, propitiation, "became sin for us", "bore in His body", etc. captures the intent of the curse language of the Old Testament. Though the exact quotation cannot be found, the concept is there. It is connected to the Old Testament use of the word curse that Paul embraces in Galatians 3:10-14 and is implied in the use of propitiation that is in those other passages as it is applied to the propitiation goat in Yum Kippur.

Consider the blessings in the Old Testament. Numbers 6:22-27 gives the statement of blessing as follows: <sup>22</sup> Then the LORD spoke to Moses, saying, <sup>23</sup> "Speak to Aaron and to his sons, saying, 'Thus you shall bless the sons of Israel. You shall say to them: <sup>24</sup> The LORD bless you, and keep you; <sup>25</sup> The LORD make His face shine on you, And be gracious to you; <sup>26</sup> The LORD lift up His countenance on you, And give you peace."<sup>27</sup> So they shall invoke My name on the sons of Israel, and I then will bless them." If a curse is the opposite of a blessing then consider Numbers 6 in reverse. "May the Lord curse you and abandon you. The Lord turn His face away from you and judge you. The Lord turn His back on you and give you enmity." To use the phrase, "God turned his back on Jesus" is simply a proverbial way of capturing the Old Testament language that Paul and even Jesus on the cross (My God why have you forsaken Me). This is what it means to be cursed. It means to have God turn His back on us. It means to be cut off from God.

In Deuteronomy 28 God provides a long list of blessings and curses which include the following statements..."The LORD will smite you..." "The LORD will strike you..." "He will put an iron yoke on your neck until He has destroyed you." "so the LORD will delight over you to make you perish and destroy you." "But there the LORD will give you a trembling heart, failing of eyes, and despair of soul." Again, when I use the statement that the Father turned His back or turned away from His own Son I am embracing the language of the Old Testament curse motif. God struck, smote, and destroyed His own Son. Jesus became a curse for us. He was treated the way the Father promised to treat Israel in this moment. He was treated as if He were to receive all of these curses from His Father that the Father had promised on those who rebel against Him. The wrath and justice of God is completely satisfied only if Jesus is treated by the curse God promised for lawbreakers. If Jesus does not receive that just punishment then the redemption is incomplete and the Father's wrath is still due on all sinners. I believe this is why Jesus uses the word "forsaken" while hanging on the cross. He is embracing the curse motif of the Old Testament. In Deuteronomy 31:17 God says this, "Then My anger will be kindled against them in that day, and I will forsake them and hide My face from them, and they will be consumed, and many evils and troubles will come upon them; so that they will say in that day, 'Is it not because our God is not among us that these evils have come upon us?'" In this verse, forsake and hiding His face are connected as equivalent ideas. I view the proverbial phrase "hiding His face" to be equivalent to our more modern phrase "turning His back." When a person turns their back, they are essentially turning their face away or hiding their face from that person. They are abandoning them. They are forsaking them. They are cutting them off. When a theologian uses the proverbial phrase, "God turned His back on Jesus," at least in my case, it is a way of saying Jesus became a curse as described in Galatians 3. The Father treated Jesus as a sinner, II Corinthians 5:21. Jesus bore the wrath of God as if He were guilty of all sin and all sins, Romans 3. The Father abandoned Him in that moment on the cross the way God said He would abandon and did ultimately abandon Israel when they fell under His curse in the Old Testament by "setting His face against them," "cutting them off," "forsaking them," "smiting them," "striking them" and "destroying them."

Think about this for a moment. On the cross, Jesus Christ took upon Himself the curse of God due to our sin. On the cross, Jesus Christ bore the wrath of His own Father so that we could become children of God. ~ Daniel




