Why I Am Still a Christian

In 1927, the famed British mathematician and atheists, Bertrand preface of the book containing his Russell delivered a lecture and subsequently published as an article in a larger work by the same name, entitled, Why I Am Not a Christian? In his arguments, he takes on two critical aspects of Christianity, the existence of God and the exemplary life of Jesus Christ. He expressed his belief that Darwinism gave a much better explanation for the existence of life while dismissing the various apologetic reasoning classically used to defend theism. He also stated his skepticism that Jesus ever existed. Even if Jesus did exist, according to Bertrand Russell, He was an imperfect man and not a very good Christian. Bertrand Russell was one of the greatest minds of his day. His frank and open dialogue about his sense of the failings of the classic arguments for the existence of God have provided successive generations of skeptics, atheists, and agnostics alike a basis for furthering their own system of anti-religious and anti-Christian worldviews. Many of the contemporary writers, in many ways, are often simply repackaging Russell's arguments.

Sounding similar to the introduction of Richard Dawkins' recent work, The life and His teachings.

God Delusion, Russell wrote in the article, "Religion is based, I think, primarily and mainly upon fear. It is partly the terror of the unknown and partly, as I have said, the wish to feel that you have a kind of elder brother who will stand by you in all your troubles and disputes...A good world needs knowledge, kindliness, and courage; it does not need a regretful hankering after the past or a fettering of the free intelligence by the words uttered long ago by ignorant men." As with many of modern atheistic works, the anger and cynical flavor of these words reflect something more than mere intellectual struggles with theism or Christianity. Something more existential, emotional and sinister seems at work.

Russell's lecture and article also prompted several Christian responses, taking him to task point by point. One such writer, John R. W. Stott, wrote a book in 2003 entitled, Why I Am a Christian, based on a series of lectures he gave in 1986 at All Souls Church, in London. I have found books by Stott, Ravi Zaccharis, Lee Strobel, John Polkinghorne, R. C. Sproul, and Allister McGrath to be extremely helpful in strengthening my faith and furthering my resolve to follow Jesus Christ, His

One thing that occurred to me in the midst of the general philosophical banter of this debate is the way these issues have shaped my own story. Many in our church have a similar background to me. Many of us grew up in Christian homes, even committed Baptist homes. My family went to church EVERY Sunday morning, Sunday evening, and Wednesday evening. It wasn't until high school that I was confronted with a world that suddenly seemed bigger than the church and theology of my childhood. In high school, we learned about other cultures and worldviews that when juxtaposed with Protestantism seemed completely alien. In addition, high school brought other challenges to cherished and unchallenged notions of God's existence, His creative work, His miraculous encounters with humanity, the sending of His Son into the world, the resurrection from the dead of Jesus Christ, and the yet future resurrection of all the dead to everlasting joy or judgment. When these very spiritual, existential, emotive concepts collide with the sterile and objective observations of microscope and telescope, believers are often confronted with challenges from the academy. Secularism, materialism, syncretism, and rationalism emerge from the historic and scientific pursuits of any student engaged in the American educational system.

The multifold clash remains even to this day a nearly daily conflict between my childhood religious system and the world outside the safe confines of evangelical, Bible Belt Christianity. I can categorize this battle into three major arenas of philosophical, historical and theological. The philosophical includes the powerful and influential arguments for the existence of God. The historical arguments deal with the credibility of the historical claims of the bible, especially with reference to Jesus Christ and His resurrection. The theological arguments focus on the bible's understanding of the human condition and the remarkable uniqueness of the person, teachings, life and death of Jesus Christ. During the first three Sunday evenings in February, I am going to take three brief messages to describe some antidotal proofs that have been particularly impactful on me. The ideas do not originate with me, but have landed on me in such a way as to verify in my heart and mind that my childhood faith is not the machinations of my parents or Baptists or religious people in general. Instead, sober and cogent thinkers have good reason to believe the claims of Jesus Christ as God's own Son, the Savior of the world.
