Our Joys and Our Challenges

One of the joys of serving as the pastor of Matthew Road Baptist Church is watching a committed group of believers work together for the glory of God. I am now near my 14th year as the pastor of this church. I have been a member for 18 years. During that time, much has changed. The world has changed. Our region and surrounding neighborhoods have changed. The church has changed. In 1997. when Kim and I moved to Grand Prairie, much of the area around the church was open fields. Now, several new neighborhoods and businesses have flooded the area. In 2001. Matthew Road was averaging around 150 a week in worship. We were a smaller group but the fellowship was sweet and the commitment to teaching God's Word and taking almost \$900,000 has gone to missions, which His Word to the nations was there. Since that time we have grown in numbers, but the underlying commitment has not changed. We live to exalt Christ for the glory of God the Father, in the power of the Spirit. Our mission is to live this passion in such a way as to know Christ and to make Him known. Our church is not perfect, but I believe we have good priorities, ones that are consistent with the heart of God as revealed in His Word. Our attendance now runs in the 500 a week range. By God's grace, we have been able to participate with God in His reach all over the world. Some of that reach has been through the Cooperative Program where we share our resources along with other churches to support the International Mission Board, North American Mission Board, Baptist General Convention of Texas and our local Association. In addition to those partnerships, we have formed several individual partnerships with church planters in India, Asia and Mexico and Bible translators in Asia, India, Africa and Papua New Guinea. We continue to support orphanages in Mexico, South Sudan and

Sudan, along with sending teams and supplies on short term trips to various locations around the globe. We get to participate in the missional heart of God through going, sending, praying and giving toward His mission to introduce the world to the Lord Jesus Christ. We want our neighbors, our state, our nation and our world to know the joy of worshiping the God who made them, through faith in the Son of God who saved them. This week I did a guick look at our growth, ministry and giving of over the last four years. Since January 1, 2011, our average attendance has increased by about 100 people. Since that time we have given almost \$4,000,000 to the church budget and various projects. Of that \$4,000,000, is nearly 25% of our giving. This is a huge aspect of joy for our church. During the four years, we have seen a substantial increase in sending, praying, going and giving toward missions. All of this provides us a real cause for celebration.

As with any church, there are a few challenges. One challenge has been the need for new small group Bible studies on Sunday mornings at 9:45 and on Sunday evenings, at 5:30. On Sunday evenings we have a new "young couples" class that has really grown and is averaging nearly 30 people each week. This is a positive sign, but quickly began to point to the need for additional Bible study groups at that same time. In addition, we need to add new groups and grow our existing Sunday morning classes. Please pray for workers and for opportunities to minister to those from our congregation and community that need a place to engage in small group Bible study. If you have an interest in helping in some aspect of the ministry of the church, please let us know so we can connect your gifts with the congregational needs.



Another challenge has been our financial numbers for the budget. It is not uncommon for us to come out of the summer months a bit behind. Usually we run about \$30,000 in the red by the end of August, but tend to get back to even by the end of the year. This year has been a bit more pronounced in that area. We came out of the summer down over \$70,000. We have made up some ground and that is very positive. Right now, we are down \$59,000 on the budget giving versus budget expenses, or about 8 percent. The finance committee has been working with staff to cut costs where possible. In addition, the finance committee has two proposals that will help with about \$20,000 of the 2014 deficit. In total, we need to take in enough giving toward the budget the remaining 10 weeks of 2014 to cover our real costs and to make up about \$35,000. In looking at the deficit for 2014, the \$59,000 works out to about \$2 per person attending Matthew Road per week. With that said, every little bit helps. If you are not in the habit of giving regularly to Matthew Road, for the sake of participating in what God is doing here and around the world through our church, begin a habit of giving every week or every other week or monthly. Plan to give joyfully and prayerfully. For those who are giving faithfully, thank you for sharing in what God is doing. If possible, for the remaining 10 weeks of the year, please consider doing just a little extra to help us close the gap on our 2014 books. Kim and I are personally going to do more than our normal monthly giving to participate in this endeavor. I know several staff members and other church members who are also making a commitment over the remaining 10 weeks to help us finish in the positive. Considering we have collected almost \$4,000,0000 with almost \$900,000 going to missions in the last four years, I think we can do this together.

One remaining challenge, please pray more fervently than ever. We need to pray for one another. We need to pray for the church. We need the prayer support of one another for the sake of His joy and for the sake of the kingdom. Remember those who serve Christ in missions around the world. Remember to lift up our leaders. Pray for the military personnel, especially those serving away from country and family. Pray for our police and firefighters and teachers and all the others that serve our communities. God honors the prayers of His people. God bless you as we joyfully struggle together for the sake of His kingdom.
