#### **Two Beautiful Psalms**

"How blessed is the man who does not walk in the Such an appropriate introduction to the entire counsel of the wicked, nor stand in the path of sinners, nor sit in the seat of scoffers! But his delight is in the law of the LORD, and in His law he meditates day and night. He will be like a tree firmly planted by streams of water, which yields its throughout the entire Bible. The connotation of fruit in its season and its leaf does not wither: and in whatever he does, he prospers. The wicked are not so, but they are like chaff which the wind drives away. Therefore the wicked will not stand in distractions. Ironically, chasing such short-term the judgment, nor sinners in the assembly of the righteous. For the LORD knows the way of the righteous, but the way of the wicked will perish.

#### Blessings

book of Psalms. The first word of the book. "blessed," indicates the tremendous benefit to hearing and following the truths of this particular book, as well as the truths communicated being blessed by God runs counter to our transient culture. We often pursue happiness, fleeting pleasures, and temporary happiness can actually hinder true blessing. As happiness seeks immediate pleasure on our own terms, blessedness seeks joy on God's terms. Happiness ultimately is idolatry- the worship of the self. Blessedness comes from an act of worship - seeking God above all else. Blessed: the inward joy that comes from God. It comes from outside us, from God. It comes on God's terms and for God's glory.

In this opening verse, the psalmist identifies hindrances to divine blessing. As Paul says, "bad company corrupts good morals.". Bad company also hinders divine blessing. If you long for the joy that only God can give, be careful how you spend your time. Don't hang out with people who are dominated by sin. Be careful where you get your advice for life. The wicked come from all sides, constantly speaking with authority into our lives saying, "Live this way! Embrace this idea! Follow this dream!" Their way sounds good, but the result is destruction and misery. The followers of God must be constantly vigilant in how we live. Notice the purposeful way in which those blessed of God live. Purposefully we are to avoid walking, standing or sitting with unrighteous people. We must purposefully avoid being swept into the sinful person's lifestyle, thinking, attitudes and pleasures.

Verse 2 juxtaposes a life committed to bad influences with that of a life committed to the Word of God. Notice the joy in this. That individual "delights in the Word of God." The blessing does not emerge from mere obedience to the Word of God. Rote submission to the Bible will not do, but instead delight, meditate, and abide in the Bible. Then comes this beautiful picture in the third verse - this picture of the blessed life. If we hear and follow the teachings of the Bible, we are like a tree planted deep, near a good source of water, producing good fruit.

Is it really worth it? Is it really worth living counter to the culture? Is the blessing better than the temporary pleasures of this life? Does the blessing remain forever? According to the psalmist, the righteous will be "in the assembly of the righteous." In other words, the righteous will be in the house when God gathers His people. The way they lived their lives will be forever credited to their account by their God. How about the life poorly lived? The psalmist considers the outcome of those three characters from verse 1, the wicked, the sinners, and the scoffers. All their deeds are forever lost. As Spurgeon says of this verse, "The righteous carve their name upon the rock, but the wicked write their remembrance in the sand. The righteous ploughs the earth, and sows a harvest here which shall never by fully reaped until they enter the enjoyments of eternity; but as for the wicked, they plough the sea, and though there may seem to be a shining trail behind his keel, yet the waves shall pass over it, and the place that knew them shall know them no more forever." Those who live in rebellion against God are wasting their lives.

Practically speaking, this plays out every day of our lives in every aspect of our lives. We must be constantly cautious in our thoughts, motives, words and actions. We must constantly war against this world's system and its sinful disposition. We must battle against the temporary pleasures that steal our eternal rewards. We fight to live in ways that will bring God's blessings, His inward, everlasting peace and soul satisfaction that He gives to those who love Him and His ways.

Jesus shared His earthly mission statement in Luke 19:10 when He stated: "For the Son of Man has come to seek and to save the lost." Our offering, together with the total offerings from all Southern Baptist churches throughout America, will help the missionaries push back lostness in North America. Thirdly, we can do our part by sharing the Good News of Jesus Christ with those who need Him.

Matthew Road Christian Counseling is sponsoring a Living Grace Group and a Family Grace group in Grand Prairie. The Living Grace group is a support program for people diagnosed with serious mental illness. The Family Grace Group is a support program specifically for parents, siblings, spouses, teen-age and adults sons and daughters, partners and significant others who are caregivers of persons with severe and persistent mental illness. The weekly sessions are held on Thursday evenings at Matthew Road Baptist Church, from 6:30pm-8:00pm.

The support groups will cover information about Building Your Faith, Stigma, Communication, Medication, Grieving and Grace, Being Holistic, You're not the Hero, Cycles and Triggers, Community, Crisis and Problem Solving, Negative and Destructive Behavior, Boundaries to Rebuild, Enabling vs. Empowering, and Staying Ahead of the Game. The Living Grace group will be facilitated by a counselor, and the Family Grace group is facilitated by 2 family members who are MHGA volunteers and have taken intensive training as course instructors.

The Grace Groups are offered at NO COST.


