Notice the pattern found in verses 7-12. Here are the terms the psalmist uses to describe the Bible: "The Law of the LORD...the testimony of the LORD...the precepts of the LORD...the commandment of the LORD...the judgments of the LORD..." With each successive title the author provides a captivating descriptor: the Bible is "perfect...sure...right...pure,..true." These titles connected with these descriptions constitute sufficient reason to study the Bible. We must desire to read things that are perfect, sure, right, pure, and true. However, the psalmist in each case gives the benefits to the Bible when we apply it to our lives. The impact of submitting to the Bible is given in each successive statement: "restoring the soul...making wise the simple...enlightening the eyes..." The Bible gives warnings to the followers of God. It exposes hidden sins. It breaks the power of abiding sin and brings purity to what we think – "the meditation of my heart..." and what we say- "the words of my mouth..." Considering these lofty affirmations about the Bible and considering the multitude of benefits, we should desire the Bible in a manner consist with these truths. In this case, the psalmist says that we should desire the bible more than a banker wants "gold" and a sweet toothed child wants "honey."

The conclusion of Psalm 19 is quite striking. Given the declaration of the glory of God from His creation in verses 1-6 and the declaration of the massive benefits to the glorious word of God, the psalmist concludes with this prayer: "Let the words of my mouth and the meditation of my heart be acceptable in Your sight, O LORD, my rock and my Redeemer." When all of these beautiful truths are considered, the title the psalmist selects for God as He addresses Him in prayer is "O LORD, my rock and my Redeemer." We can trust Him to help us and save us. Just look at what He has already done in His creation and in His Word!

Our offering, together with the total offerings from all Southern Baptist churches throughout America, will help the missionaries push back lostness in North America. Thirdly, we can do our part by sharing the Good News of Jesus Christ with those who need Him.

Matthew Road Christian Counseling is sponsoring a Living Grace Group and a Family Grace group in Grand Prairie. The Living Grace group is a support program for people diagnosed with serious mental illness. The Family Grace Group is a support program specifically for parents, siblings, spouses, teen-age and adults sons and daughters, partners and significant others who are caregivers of persons with severe and persistent mental illness. The weekly sessions are held on Thursday evenings at Matthew Road Baptist Church 4601 Matthew Rd., Grand Prairie 75052, from 6:30pm-8:00pm.

The support groups will cover information about Building Your Faith, Stigma, Communication, Medication, Grieving and Grace, Being Holistic, You're not the Hero, Cycles and Triggers, Community, Crisis and Problem Solving, Negative and Destructive Behavior, Boundaries to Rebuild, Enabling vs. Empowering, and Staying Ahead of the Game. The Living Grace group will be facilitated by a counselor, and the Family Grace group is facilitated by 2 family members who are MHGA volunteers and have taken intensive training as course instructors.
