"What Does the LORD Require of You and Me?"

Micah 6:8

One aspect of school that endears a teacher to students is clearly communicated requirements. A wellstructured, difficult course trumps an easy, yet vague course. We need the requirements laid out for us. We want to know how to please a teacher, a parent, or a boss. During the prophetic ministry of Micah, life was not going well for Judah. The Assyrians destroyed the much of the affairs in the southern kingdom. The prophetic message coming from Micah and his contemporaries (Isaiah, Amos) revealed that God was using the Assyrian kingdom as a divine rebuke of the dishonesty, the internal strife, and the idolatry of Judah. Like a failing student near the end of the semester, Judah came to God looking for an escape from their mess. They asked, "What does God require from us to make this calamity go away?" Like a failing student in a panic, Judah even came to God with some suggestions of makeup work and even the offer of gifts. They hoped their extravagant efforts might get them out of their bad grade. "God, what if we bring you some offerings like a thousand rams for sacrifice or ten thousand rivers of Surely God would be impressed with such tremendous expressions of religion. Whether a student can bribe a teacher in an attempt to garner better scores is doubtful. However, with God this type of bribery always fails. It always fails because we can practice all types of external religious activities - church attendance, giving, and extravagant singing, without engaging our hearts.

God ultimately requires our heart. Any external religious expressions must proceed out of a genuine heart for God and others. Church attendance purely from habit or obligation, falls well short of the passion to experience God that marks a relationship with Him. Giving of time, money, and other resources, must display a joyful love worthy of a relationship with the Creator of all resources. All religious activities such as singing, praying, reading of scripture, participating in the Lord's Supper, and experiencing baptism, are empty actions apart provide us a means to express our ongoing walk with God.

In order to be in right relationship with God, to

God gives us three foundational principles that regulates all religious expressions. What does God required? He requires three things, all of which reflect a transformed condition of the heart. 1) To do justice. Judah crumbled under the oppression of her most vulnerable citizens at the hands of the rich and powerful. This requirement calls for us to not only restrain from any oppression of the helpless, but to stand in the gap for the oppressed in the world today. Proverbs 21:3 says it this way, "to do righteousness and justice is northern kingdom of Israel and were now controlling desired by the LORD more than sacrifice." Doing the right thing in the sight of God and for the care of others requires a change of heart, will, mind, emotion. Offering a thousand animals produces a significant religious show that can be done without ever engaging the heart. 2) To love kindness. There was strife among the people of Judah - harsh words and harsh treatment. Kindness must mark the children of God. Paul says in Ephesians 4:32, "Be kind to one another, tender-hearted, forgiving each other, just as God in Christ also has forgiven you." God requires kindness for the nation of Israel, for a church, and for a home. Kindness reflects the true heart of the person who is living according to God's requirements for relationships. 3) To walk humbly with your Humility in our relationship with God acknowledges two critical truths. First, our humility toward God acknowledges how great He really is. Second, our humility toward God acknowledges how dependent on Him we really are. This humility of heart proceeds out of our walk with God and spills over into our relationships with others. If we live under the weight of our absolute dependence on the God who made us, we will live with humility toward others as well.

Religion can be a curse. We at times treat our religious expression as a means to an end. We want things from God, but we do not want God Himself. We want the benefits of the relationship with God, but we do not want the relationship with God. A disengaged heart, no matter how religious, does not meet the requirements of God. God looks at the heart. Religion often focuses on our external actions. No amount of external religious expression can cloak a heart that is far from God. God from an abiding affection for God whereby these actions looks at the heart and what He requires from our hearts is justice, kindness, and humility.

I am so excited to have the choir leading once again on Sunday mornings! "How Great Thou Art" is one of my all-time favorite hymns, and I had been waiting a couple of weeks for the choir's return before scheduling it to be sung again. It's undeniably moving to hear so many voices joined together, boldly singing of our Lord's work on earth: creating, sustaining, saving, and restoring.

The story of how this hymn came to popular use in America is truly fascinating! In 1885, a 26-year-old Swedish Minister named Carl Boberg wrote a poem titled "O Mighty God". This was published, paired with an old Swedish melody, and largely forgotten. Years later, an English missionary named Stuart Hine heard the song while serving in Russia. Drawing inspiration from his experiences in the Carpathian mountains, he heavily reworked the text and revised the tune. Finally, evangelist J. Edwin Orr heard the hymn being sung by a Naga tribe living in Assam, India. He brought the hymn to America to be used in his evangelistic meetings in 1953 and was soon popularized by George Beverly Shea. What an amazing story! More details can be found in a wonderful book called "Then Sings My Soul" by Robert J. Morgan.




