The Word of God is Living and Active

"For the word of God is living and active and sharper than any two-edged sword, and piercing as far as the division of soul and spirit, of both joints and marrow, and able to judge the thoughts and intentions of the heart. And there is no creature hidden from His sight, but all things are open and laid bare to the eyes of Him with whom we have to do. Therefore, since we have a great high priest who has passed through the heavens, Jesus the Son of God, let us hold fast our confession. For we do not have a high priest who cannot sympathize with our weaknesses, but One who has been tempted in all things as we are, yet without sin. Therefore let us draw near with confidence to the throne of grace, so that we may receive mercy and find grace to help in time of need." Hebrews 4:12-16

This powerful verse should draw us back to the prologue to the Gospel of John. "The word of God" is literally "the Logos of God." The usual interpretation of this passage directs our attention to the written words of the Bible. If that is the author's intent the literal translation would be "for the Bible is living and active..." However, the pronoun of verse 13 should cause us to carefully consider another alternative. If verse 12 presented the Bible as a tool for judging the thoughts and intentions of the heart, then verse 13 should say, "And there is no creature hidden from its words." Not only this, but verse 14 functions in similar fashion to verse 14 of John's prologue, introducing the person who bears the "Logos" title. Jesus Christ is our great High Priest. Therefore, the pronoun of verse 13, the naming of our great High Priest in verse 14 along with the title of "logos" in the vein of John's prologue drives me toward a different interpretation. "For the Word" – "the Logos who was in the beginning with God and the Logos was God" (John 1:1) - Jesus Christ, the Son of God, judges all "the thoughts and intentions of the heart." He judges so precisely that the author compares Him to a sharp, two-edged sword, separating every thought, word, and action into good or evil. He is able to do this because everything is completely "laid bare" to His eyes. There is a terrifying reality described in these verses. Jesus Christ, the Logos, sees and knows everything down to the very motive of the heart. Regardless of the external appearance of nobility, Jesus sees the driving heart forces behind the action. He judges with exactness and He judges completely.

The Compassionate High Priest

The terrifying reality of Jesus Christ judging in this way might cause us to despair. The next verse presents such an encouraging word. "*Therefore, since we have a great high priest who has passed through the heavens, Jesus the Son of God, let us hold fast our confession.*" Yes, Jesus Christ judges with petrifying exactness. He also mercifully acts as our High Priest. He speaks to the Father on our behalf, continually seeking grace and mercy for us in His Father's presence. Our High Priest, Jesus Christ the righteous One understands our weaknesses. He was like us in that He faced great temptation while He walked this earth. However, He can be our High Priest like no other person can be our High Priest. He lived His life in absolute perfection. Given His compassion toward us as we face temptation and given His sinless perfection providing an everlasting righteous standing before His Father, we can confidently come to Him for help with all our troubles.
