



## Barriers to Beauty

I recently read a quote from an interview a preacher gave with Oprah; I am not a fan of this particular preacher's theology and generally think he falls outside of Christian orthodoxy. However, this quote caused me to contemplate both the truth of this idea and the challenges of his illustration. He describes our desire to encounter God in the following way. He says that God is "like a song you hear in another room, and you think: *Wow, that sounds beautiful, but I can only hear a little bit.* So you start opening doors and rearranging furniture 'cause you have to get in that room to hear that song. And when you get in, you find the knobs, and you turn them all to the right because you're like, *I gotta hear more of that.*"

This illustration is conceptually similar to the quote by Augustine who said, "*You have made us for yourself, O Lord, and our heart is restless until it rests in you.*"

It also reminds me of Paul's statement to the Athenians in Acts 17:24-28: "*The God who made the world and all things in it, since He is Lord of heaven and earth, does not dwell in temples made with hands; nor is He served by human hands, as though He needed anything, since He Himself gives to all people life and breath and all things; and He made from one man every nation of mankind to live on all the face of the earth, having determined their appointed times and the boundaries of their habitation, that they would seek God, if perhaps they might grope for Him and find Him, though He is not far from each one of us; for in Him we live and move and exist, as even*

*some of your own poets have said, 'For we also are His children.'*" There is great truth in all of these statements. Of course there is divine truth in Paul's assertion. God is present everywhere in the world and the glory of God is infinitely beautiful. He is like the greatest song ever played, being heard for the first time, only greater. He is like the most beautiful scenic vista ever, being seen for the first time, only more beautiful. He is like the most splendid sunrise over the most stunning beach, only greater than that. In fact, He is so much greater than music or the beauty of the creation that these experiences simply inspire a greater longing of our hearts to see the Creator behind the beauty of the creation. We instinctively know there is something more, something greater that is behind the grandest experiences of this life.

This all sounds quite appealing. A glorious Creator who invites us to know Him. As Paul says, "He is not far from each one of us." Who wouldn't want such an encounter? What would keep anyone away from our Creator if He is that accessible? What keeps us from getting into "that room to hear that song?" What keeps us then from finding this ultimate song? What keeps us from finding our rest in God? What prevents us from knowing the God in whom "we live and move and exist?" What is not addressed in these illustrations is the great impediment. The problem with trying to find that music in the adjacent room is that the furniture in the room is not so easily moved and the doors and windows are not merely closed or locked but have been welded shut by

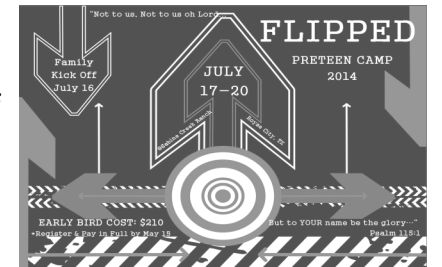

the rebellion of the human heart. As there is great beauty in God and in His creation, there is also an ugliness to life. There is an aspect of life that bars us from seeing the beauty we were meant to see. It's not as easy as simply moving a couch or opening a window. We, in the hardness of our hearts, want to be our own greatest song. We are fine if God wishes to play in the background as long as He doesn't interrupt our musical score. Like a two year old banging on the kitchen pots and pans with a wooden spoon, we drown out the beauty of the symphony of God's character. Somehow we are delusional enough to think that our own musical score is better. We want to be the star. We want to be the center of the universe. When someone speaks to us, it is difficult for us to listen because of our own immaturity and because of the noise we are creating. The beauty of the song of God still plays. We just can't hear it over our own pitiful rendition of His masterpiece.

This is why the ugliness of the cross and the humility of Christ must bridge the worlds between our self-exalting madness and the beauty of God. The cross displays, in such striking terms, the severity of our broken-down furniture and our tightly closed doors and windows. The cross of Christ accomplishes many different things such as satisfying the wrath of God, making a just payment for human sin, providing a means to see God's love and mercy and displaying the everlasting grace of God. One feature of the very public and graphic demonstration by God in His Son's agonizing death is the ability for us to see the seriousness and severity of our own rebellion. This is what sin does to us. This is what sin looks like. Our sin destroys us and everyone around us. It prevents good from being seen as truly good and elevates evil in the place of good. Sin takes language and music and art and transforms these instinctively good things into tools for evil. Instead of seeing God through these mediums, we idolize the medium to our own destruction.

Paul told the church at Corinth, *"I sought to know nothing among you but Jesus Christ and Him crucified."* Apart from the cross, we are forever separated from what should be the greatest longing of our heart. We were made to see, know and experience the beauty of God and to enjoy His beauty forever. Our sin creates massive barriers to seeing God as He really is. Christ bore our sin to create a way to fulfill our ultimate purpose.
